

BEFORE

MEET THE REQUIREMENTS

Quilts have THREE:

- A finished size of 60" x 80"
- Sturdy
- Warm
- Kits have TWO:
 - All kits must contain ONLY and ALL items listed
 - New items only, except where otherwise noted.

REMEMBER THE RESTRICTIONS

- **NO FLEECE** in QUILTS or ANY KITS. We will accept other fabrics that include microfiber.
- NO RELIGIOUS or PATRIOTIC SYMBOLS, LANGUAGE or MESSAGES.
- PACK PROPERLY
- Pack completed quilts and kits **separately** in boxes, not to exceed 40 lbs.
- Create your own label OR write on your boxes in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS (example below).

In 2023, a massive earthquake in Türkiye left thousands of families in crisis. In faith and generosity, Lutherans like you rushed help and hope during this time of unimaginable loss.

Over the past year, much of the world has since turned its attention — and funding — elsewhere. **But your love has persisted**, easing suffering and meeting critical needs as families and communities work to recover.

Leyla Güleryüz has been living in a tent with eight other relatives since the earthquake obliterated her family's home. Their makeshift setup includes a shed for cooking, a greenhouse for growing vegetables, and a tent where the family sleeps at night. The cold is numbing, but the tent's flammable nylon material makes fires for warmth too dangerous.

Leyla is overwhelmed by life's challenges that have been exacerbated by the earthquake. Both of her parents are chronically ill — her father with heart failure and hypertension and her mother with cancer. Her grandfather is epileptic, and her sister-in-law faced many challenges giving birth to her son in the disaster's aftermath.

To make matters worse, few nearby public health centers and hospitals remain operational. Many doctors left the country after the earthquake. The private hospitals demand money that Leyla's family simply does not have.

Because their home is on a less traveled road, they are often forgotten by aid workers.

The challenges are many and the conditions heartbreaking, but love overcomes. And yours is unwavering.



Leyla and her family received LWR Quilts, Personal Care Kits and Baby Care Kits. They said the quilts are especially useful because "it gets very bitterly cold at night." The baby items will be used for Leyla's nephew.

"It made us feel very special," Leyla says. "Because it is very difficult to reach us. We don't have electricity most of the time. With these things, it will allow us to warm up in a better way."

C The comfort of your compassion

The members of **Messiah Lutheran Church in Madison**, **Alabama**, knew the power of caring hearts when they formed their quilting group "The Comforters" more than 20 years ago.

Your quilts and kits bring tangible benefits. Quilts are used as warm bedding, simple tents or floor coverings. Kits allow those in often uncertain and uncomfortable living conditions to care for their babies and themselves and maintain a sense of dignity.

But as founder **Annette Joens** knew when naming the group, providing hope and comfort is equally life changing. Knowing someone cares, someone prays for them and that they are not forgotten can often be the most profound effect of all for our neighbors around the world.

Fittingly, the quilts also comfort the group's members. Annette passed away in August of 2022, mere days before her church's quilt blessing and Ingathering. During the memorial service, her family and friends celebrated her life, comforted by the quilts laid out on pews in preparation for blessing, reminding everyone of her lifelong compassion and service.







IT TAKES A VILLAGE

With more than two decades under their belt, the Comforters understand the importance of collaboration, teamwork and feeling comfortable with the tasks they choose.

Jeanette Beamer, a passionate lifelong sewer who joined the group within two weeks of moving to Alabama from Minnesota, leads the quilting group. LeeLinda Baggett handles promotion and communication for the group, taking pictures and sharing the group's work as a member of the LWR Quilters & Kit Makers Facebook Community. In 2022, they made **105** quilts and grew to **120** quilts in 2023. They are well underway on their 2024 quilts.

COLLEGE STUDENTS PITCH IN

Separately, **Dr. Rhonda Gaede** oversees Messiah Lutheran's Kit Makers. As an Associate Provost and Professor at the University of Alabama, she gets college students involved as part of the kit assembly group. In 2022, the group completed **754 Personal Care Kits, 746 School Kits and 393 Baby Care Kits.** In 2023, they held a packing blitz and assembled over **700 School Kits in 75 minutes**.

It takes many individuals to bring comfort to our neighbors around the world. **We are grateful for all of you!**

A^t first, **Steve Colson** watched his wife **Pat** sew from the sidelines. A dedicated member of her quilting group with **Trinity Lutheran Church in Park Forest, Illinois,** Pat often brought sewing "work" home. Before long, Steve's interest was piqued, and he asked Pat to teach him.

After he tried it for the first time, he was hooked. "At first Pat encouraged me," says Steve, who has been sewing quilt tops for LWR for nearly a decade. "Now, she thinks I sew too much! She can't get a turn at the machine!"

When they retired to Florida several years ago, Steve and Pat joined **Atonement Lutheran Church in Wesley Chapel.** They didn't have a quilting group yet, so the couple set up a sewing area at home, which quickly grew to take over the top floor.

They send quilt tops home with their former church friends when they visit for the winter. In exchange, they receive more fabric to make more quilt tops! The couple also makes frequent visits to Park Forest to reconnect with loved ones. During these visits, they bring more quilt tops for the quilters at Trinity to finish and pick up more fabric. The cycle continues.

"I know our quilt tops are not quilt show material, pun intended, but that's not the point," Steve says. "We're part of making warm, comfortable and sturdy quilts that will help someone."
