Edward Lynch (pictured above) served our nation in the Persian Gulf as a United States Marine. As he worked to rebuild his life, he moved into the Veterans Restoration Quarters, which provides relief services for veterans who do not have homes. When Hurricane Helene struck, the entire shelter was flooded — causing all 165 residents to find themselves searching for home ... again.

Thankfully, your compassion reached these service members with comforting quilts — wrapping them in love when they needed it most.

“When I lost everything, this is one of the first and nicest things I got,” Edward says of his LWR Mission Quilt. “And it gave me something to hold onto in the midst of a crisis.”

In Tampa, your fast-acting generosity helped those who were suffering from homelessness prior to the storm. This vulnerable population found the tents they were living in and all their possessions completely washed away when Hurricane Milton struck.

Your compassionate heart helped deliver new tents as well as nourishing food, transportation, employment assistance and medical and dental services for your fragile neighbors.

A New Initiative Fueled by Your Love

Salamatu is one of the lucky ones. In Sierra Leone, where Salamatu lives, one-third of girls are forced to drop out of school by age 12 — and about half of kids her age have to work hard to help support their families.

Half of Sierra Leoneans reported **lack of income** as a top **barrier in accessing education.**



Nearly 50% of Sierra Leonean women have **never attended school.**

Fortunately, Salamatu is blessed to be able to start her day by going to school. She loves learning and excels in her favorite subjects, grammar and reading. She has the freedom to dream about her future, which includes becoming a nurse.

This dream is possible thanks to Salamatu's Aunt Fatmata, who was determined her niece would not have the same life she lived. You see, Fatmata was only in fourth grade when she had to drop out of school. Her father died, and she had to help care for her family. That's why Fatmata is determined to pay for Salamatu's education with what little money she has.

But there are so many girls who don't have a champion, like Fatmata, to help them realize their dreams. Luckily, they do have YOU!

Thanks to your faithful support, we recently launched a pilot program to address barriers that get in the way of girls' education. We look forward to sharing more about this initiative with you! ■

Celebrating a Century of Service

Glendale Lutheran Church in Burien, Washington, hosted its final service on

Easter 2023. While its doors may have closed, one faithful parishioner made sure it would be remembered forever.

Thelma Dill — who turned 100 this October — has many special memories dating back to the church's earliest days. The church opened just two years before Thelma moved from Brownsville, Ohio, to Washington, where she met her fiancé, Joe, just before he left to fight in World War II in 1943.

Shortly after he returned to the U.S., the couple was married at Glendale Lutheran. A few years later their son, Greg, was baptized and confirmed at the same church.

Thelma became an active member of the quilting ministry — stitching her love into countless quilts well into her 90s. She only stopped when her eyesight started to fail.

Thelma and Joe always thought they would include Glendale Lutheran in their estate planning because, as Thelma states, “The church was the center of our lives.” Upon its closing, Thelma instead included Lutheran World Relief in those plans so she could help as many people as possible. Thelma is an active giver today, saying that she and Greg “have everything they need.”
