You may remember your neighbor Nyaluit and her sons, Mar and Nyayien. They lived a heartbreaking life, navigating dangerous flood waters, shielding violence, battling starvation and suffering through a devastating loss when Nyaluit's husband was killed.

Knowing she had to try to make a better life for herself and her children, Nyaluit embarked on a dangerous 70-mile trek to safety.

"It was a very difficult journey because some people want to kill you," she recalled.

Nyaluit finally found a camp where she and her family could take refuge, and thanks to your compassionate gifts, they were met with nourishing

food, refreshing water and safe shelter. Sadly, the relief was short-lived when two of her precious babies, 4-year-old Nyayien and 2-year-old Mar, became very ill with measles.

Nyaluit was terrified. The hospital that could deliver the care her sons needed was only reachable by canoe, and she did not have access to one. Time was running out ... until your love sped to the rescue!

You Helped a Loving Couple Grow a Fruitful Future

Love always finds a way ... even against all odds.

Dipak BK and Laxmi* live in Nepal, where 70% of marriages are arranged. That makes it very difficult for young couples to have any say in who they spend their lives with "till death do them part."

Dipak and Laxmi met when they were 14 years old when Laxmi's family was farming land near Dipak's home. After several years of friendship, they knew they wanted to build a life together rooted in love and mutual respect.

But their families had other plans.

You see, Dipak is Dalit, meaning he was born into one of the lowest castes in Nepal's social hierarchy, while Laxmi was born into a higher caste. And intercaste marriages are still largely frowned upon in Nepal. Despite their love for each other, the two were forbidden to marry.

Laxmi's parents received several offers from suitors who were interested in an arranged marriage. But, Laxmi's heart belonged to Dipak, and she refused them all.

Knowing Laxmi would be forced to accept a suitor eventually, the couple eloped. His parents were angry, and Laxmi's disowned her completely.

It was difficult for the couple to have both sets of parents reject their loving marriage, but Dipak was determined

to build a life for them on his own, stating, "Until a man leaves home, he will not learn about life."

Opportunities are limited for someone like Dipak, but luckily the newlyweds had neighbors like you in their corner.

The couple traveled eight hours away from home to Gulariya, a small town near the border of India, where Dipak has extended family. Once there, his uncle shared with him that Lutheran World Relief was made up of caring neighbors who could help the young couple.

Your generous gifts helped Dipak get the tools and training the couple needed to start their own business farming bananas.

He completed a one-month intensive training on banana cultivation and learned how to cultivate his crop, how and when to fertilize, and how to protect his fruit from pests and weeds.

His love, Laxmi, is beside him every step of the way. "She has been supporting me a lot," Dipak says. "I was only able to do this because of her support. When I come here to work, she brings my lunch to the field. We eat, then both of us work together."

She also tells me her ideas, like 'I would do this or that ...' She thinks about this even more than I do. In fact, she teaches me a lot of things ...
She motivates and energizes me.

Their love, and their harvest, has inspired their families! Both Laxmi and Dipak's parents have reunited with them and fully support the couple in their endeavors.

Your gifts have also planted seeds of hope for the future of more than 500 youth and women in Nepal who have started banana farms, opened tailoring businesses and launched other entrepreneurial adventures.

Thanks to you, these young people are cultivating their own futures ... and the outlook is very sweet.
